- Actuarial concentration first offered in Fall 2001
- TCU program planned with guidance from Dr. Jim Daniel of UT Austin
- Added minor in Actuarial Mathematics in Fall 2010

Degree Plan

- Actuarial concentration offered as an option on the Math BA or BS degree plans
- Minimum of 34 hours in Math, 12 hours in Economics, and 9 hours in Accounting and Finance
- TCU liberal arts core required of all students

Actuarial Mathematics Minor

- Appeals to Economics or Finance majors
